INTEREST12 (Mandy Zuo) Finance minister Lou Jiwei said the US does not have the condition to increase interest rates, saying the world's biggest economy has the responsibility to boost global economic development. Speaking on the sideline of an IMF and World Bank meeting in Lima, Lou said the economics in Europe have improved after reforms, but that they are facing challenges of the refugee crisis. On China, Lou said China has to ensure that economic growth to be within a reasonable range, and will continue implementing structural reforms. A top Chinese central banker said a "persistent" weakening of the yuan would be inconsistent with the fundamentals of the world's second-biggest economy, and the country is committed to making its currency regime more flexible and market based + FS John Tsang will meet and ask Yellen in Lima when the US will raise interest rates. 30cm

*LANKA12 (Deb) Sri Lanka's new leaders are banking on Chinese investment to revive a port project that became a symbol of the last government's excesses bankrolled by China. Situated at the southern tip of the strategically located Indian Ocean nation, Hambantota gained notoriety as a port without ships and was the opposition's butt of criticism of the China-friendly Mahinda Rajapaksa's tendency to throw Chinese money at vanity projects to line his pockets. "We have US\$1.5 billion sunk in the project and no revenue. So we need to make use of it. We would want Chinese investors to come and help turn it into a dockyard as well as invest in an industrial park there," Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs Harsha de Silva told the South China morning Post in an exclusive interview. 40cm Spill to A3

CHINANK12: Holding hands with top Chinese official, North Korea's leader Kim Jong-un tells the world that Beijing is by his side He was the only foreign dignitary of any significance at the event - and it showed. While a stream of goose-stepping soldiers, columns of tanks, a range of missiles and other armaments passed through Kim II Sung Square in the heart of Pyongyang for the 70th anniversary of the founding of the ruling Workers' Party, North Korean leader Kim Jong-un frequently smiled and talked to Liu Yunshan, the Chinese Communist Party's fifth-ranked leader. At the end of the event, Kim and Liu, the highest-ranking official of China in four years to be in Pyongyang, held hands as they waved to the crowd that began chanting the North Korean leader's name. (40CM) + PICPHUKETRIOTS12: An angry crowd hurled homemade fire bombs and torched vehicles at a police station on Thailand's resort island of Phuket to protest the deaths of two young men who died in a motorcycle crash while being chased by police. COCOISLANDS12: A sparsely populated cluster of Indian Ocean islands has become the unlikely focus of allegations that Myanmar's government is spiking the chances of democracy icon Aung San Suu Kyi's opposition party in next month's landmark general election. Both the ruling Union Solidarity and Development Party (USDP) and the Nobel peace laureate's National League for Democracy (NLD) have fielded candidates on the Coco Islands, an archipelago off Myanmar's west coast and the country's smallest parliamentary constituency. NEPALPM12: Reporting as Nepal's parliament votes to elect the country's next prime minister, three weeks after adopting a new constitution that has triggered deadly protests and a border blockade

BAG12 (Ernest) Green groups have bestowed rare praise on an expanded government levy scheme that they claim has helped reduce plastic bag use at newsstands by nearly 90 per cent since it came into force six months ago, but it still has room to improve. A survey by Greeners Action on 160 newspaper vendors around town found 79 per cent no longer pre-bagged newspapers and magazines in plastic, while 90 per cent of 1,112 thousand consumers polled no longer requested them. 35cm MAIN PIC

HA12 (Emily) Public hospitals' major crisis of having a record high number of doctors retiring next two years has been delayed - temporarily by a few years- under a new scheme that have recruited 60 of the 100 departing practitioners, the Hospital Authority said.
